SIBs Club



Koorana Child & Family Services provides learning opportunities for all children and their families across the Inner West and South West areas of Sydney.

What is SIBs Club?

SIBs Club is an after school recreational program for children who have a brother or sister (sibling) with a disability, developmental delay and/or difficult behaviours.



Who is it for?

SIBs Club is for primary school children aged 7 – 12 whose brother or sister has a disability or developmental delay, or presents with difficult behaviour.



What happens and how will it help us?

The program is fun and relaxed, and gives your child the opportunity to play and spend time with other children in similar circumstances.

SIBs Club is run by experienced and qualified group leaders who encourage fun in a safe and therapeutic environment.

The group leaders will assist your child to develop important life skills through activities that sensitively support their specific needs.

They will support your child to understand and manage feelings associated with having a brother or sister with additional needs, and help your child to develop coping strategies and increased resilience.

Where does it happen?

SIBs Club meets in Lakemba.

How long does it go for?

SIBs Club happens one afternoon a week during school terms. There's also an excursion during school holiday periods.

What if I do not speak English?

Your worker can arrange for an interpreter if you need.

What does it cost?

SIBs Club is free, and afternoon tea is provided. Disability-specific government funding covers the weekly costs, however excursions usually have a fee dependent upon the activity and transport requirements.
